Bathtub/Shower

- If your bathtub faucet is dripping, it may be due to the diverter. The diverter is either the middle of three knobs or if you have a single fixture, a small pin that is pulled out to divert the water. If the diverter is still closed, trapped water can trickle out through the faucet slowly over a few hours. Opening the diverter will release the water through the faucet.
- If there is a constant stream of water or drip coming from the bathroom faucet, or you cannot completely shut the water off by turning the knob and the issue is not due to water trapped in the diverter, please contact management to repair the dripping faucet.
- If you suddenly notice that the water pressure coming from your shower head is much slower than usual, please contact maintenance. It might be simply some minerals have built up in the shower head, causing the water to come out slower than usual.

Chief Cox and his officers did a great job discussing training and answering member questions.

- Barton Drive will be closed to through traffic for the duration of the construction. Driveway access for local traffic will be maintained, but may include delay during working hours. Cross street traffic will be maintained as much as possible.
- Water service will be interrupted for short durations during water main installation. Disruptions will be limited, and residents will be informed in advance.
- General noise and dust from equipment, particularly during site excavation.
- Property owners adjacent to new infrastructure features such as curb and gutter or sidewalks will be specially assessed for the cost of those items. Sidewalk installation is dependent upon the public engagement outcome and City Council approval.

Pat will always be a pillar of the Arrowwood community because this is her home.



Some of her intimate thoughts:

"The Corona virus has changed everyone's plans and to add insult to injury the injustice of the treatment of Black and Brown people has reared its ugly head in a way that has not been seen since the 50-60's. 2020 will be a year, we will never forget. All our formal plans to introduce, transition and celebrate from the old to the new manager were postponed. I do hope to see you from a safe distance and waive to you at the upcoming outdoor Annual meeting. Please know you will always be a part of my heart, I love this place: and I am forever grateful to our volunteers, staff and Board who made this a great place to call home. Be safe, wear a mask for peace sake. And please respect with gratitude all the essential workers, especially our Arrowwood members. We will get through this together. We are Arrowwood Strong!"


