

## **BYLAWS BULLETIN**

#### What exactly are the bylaws?

The by-laws are a set of rules and procedures that state how the cooperative will conduct its business. The by-laws must abide by both the articles of incorporation and the laws of the state of Michigan. The bylaws address such topics as the purpose of the cooperative, membership, annual meetings, fiscal management, and the board of directors.

#### Where can I find AHC's bylaws?

## Section 8

Section 8 is a program that assists low-income individuals and families with paying housing costs. The state of Michigan uses income limits set by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to establish the criteria for Section 8 housing.

Arrowwood continues to operate under a project-based Section 8 contract with HUD. If you have questions about Section 8 and/or would like to find out if you qualify, contact the office for more information.





# Recycling

Hello neighbors! We are fortunate to have excellent recycling services in Ann Arbor. This helps cut down on waste going into landfills, protect our waterways and forests, and keep our environment clean. In 2021, with your help, Recycle Ann Arbor diverted **15,698 tons** of materials from the landfill!

#### Here are some pointers to make recycling easier and more effective for everyone:

- Please rinse out all containers before placing them in a bin.
- Remove metal lids from jars and place them in the recycle bin too.
- If you are able, please flatten plastic jugs, cans, and boxes so the bins will not fill up so fast.
- Remove any food or liners from pizza boxes before placing them in the bin.

#### Items that are recyclable:

Aerosol cans (empty): Before you throw the can in the recycling bin, please
make sure it is indeed empty because if it has any chemicals left, it could cause
hazardous chemicals to contaminate the rest of the recyclables in the load.



- **Plant pots (rigid plastic)**: As long as your plant pots are not made out of soft, flimsy plastic (like the black plastic planters), they can be recycled. Make sure the pots are clean!
- Aluminum foil (clean): Roll the aluminum foil into a ball, preferably at least the size of your fist. Making your foil into a larger, 3-dimensional form helps it get sorted into the proper place at the Materials Recovery Facility. If it is flattened, the machines may sort it into the paper. If it is too small, it is vulnerable to literally "falling through the cracks." Clean aluminum pans/trays can also be recycled if properly cleaned and balled up.
- Aseptic containers (Tetra Pak): These are food and drink cartons that hold items such as broth, soups, fruit juice, and plant milk. Make sure that there is no leftover liquid or food inside your cartons before recycling, and throw away plastic caps—do not screw them back on the Tetra Pak.
- Milk cartons (plastic or paper): Make sure there is no liquid left inside the cartons. If there is any milk left inside, the carton will be considered contaminated and sent to the landfill.



Items that should NOT be placed in recycle bins: Styrofoam, plastic bags, paper or plastic cups, paper plates, plastic packaging cushions/air pillows, batteries, coffee and creamer pods (e.g., Keurig), light bulbs, foil bags and wrappers (e.g., from chips and granola bars), broken glass, ice cream containers, flat plastic lids that snap onto plastic tubs, plastic cutlery, prescription bottles, and tissue paper.

#### Honey Garlic Chicken Stir Fry

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 tablespoon + 1 teaspoon vegetable oil divided use
- 1 cup thinly sliced peeled carrots
- 2 cups broccoli florets
- 1 lb boneless skinless chicken breasts, cut into 1 inch pieces
- 4 cloves garlic minced
- 1/4 cup low sodium chicken broth or water
- 1/4 cup soy sauce
- 3 tablespoons honey
- 2 teaspoons **cornstarch**
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon **onion powder**
- salt and pepper to taste
- Optional for even more veggies: white onion, green and orange pepper! Add when you cook the broccoli and carrots.

#### **DIRECTIONS**

- 1. Heat 1 teaspoon of oil in a large pan over medium heat.
- 2. Add the broccoli and carrots and cook for approximately 4 minutes or until vegetables are tender.
- 3. Remove the vegetables from the pan; place them on a plate and cover.
- 4. Wipe the pan clean with a paper towel and turn the heat to high.
- 5. Add the remaining tablespoon of oil.
- 6. Season the chicken pieces with salt, pepper, garlic powder and onion powder and add them to the pan in a single layer you may need to do this step in batches. Cook for 3-4 minutes on each side until golden brown and cooked through.
- 7. Add the garlic to the pan and cook for 30 seconds.
- 8. Add the vegetables back to the pan and cook for 2 more minutes or until the vegetables are warmed through.
- 9. In a bowl whisk together the chicken broth, honey and soy sauce.
- 10. In a small bowl mix the cornstarch with a tablespoon of cold water.
- 11. Pour the soy sauce mixture over the chicken and vegetables; cook for 30 seconds.
- 12. Add the cornstarch and bring to a boil; cook for 1 more minute or until sauce has just started to thicken.
- 13. Serve immediately with rice.
